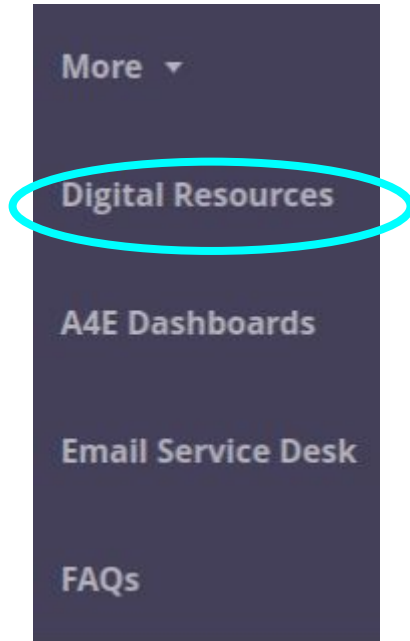
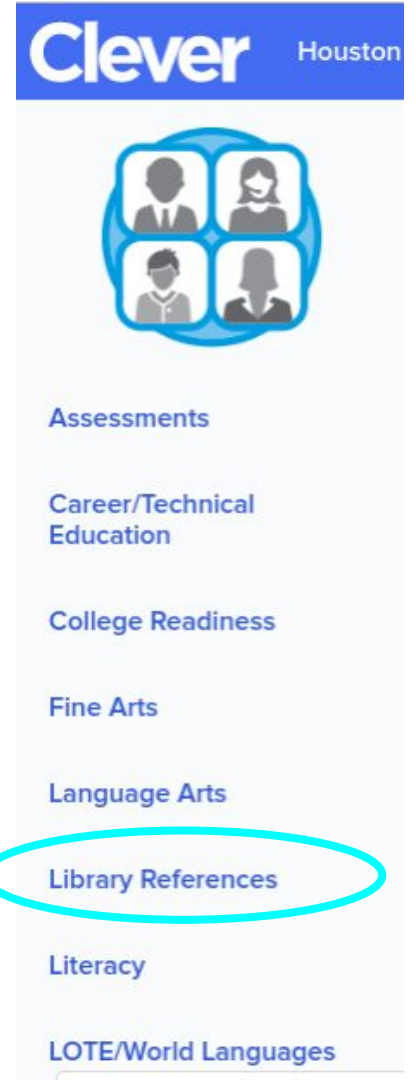


How to use Gale Databases

First, you need to get to Clever, through Digital Resources on the HUB.

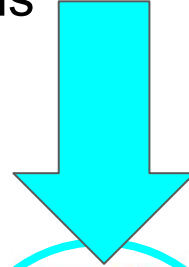


Then, you need to find Library References.



Remember how important it is to give credit to your sources!

After you have written your citation information, it's time to start answering the questions you came up with. The answers to those questions are the "Notefacts" (as IIM calls them). You can write these on your own paper, or type them out.

The "Notefacts" do not need to be submitted. Nothing needs to be submitted! This is not for a grade.

The purpose of this research is just to give you an opportunity to practice and build good research habits.
